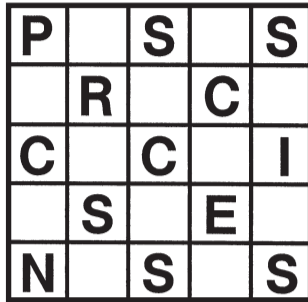
## Five by Five Competition

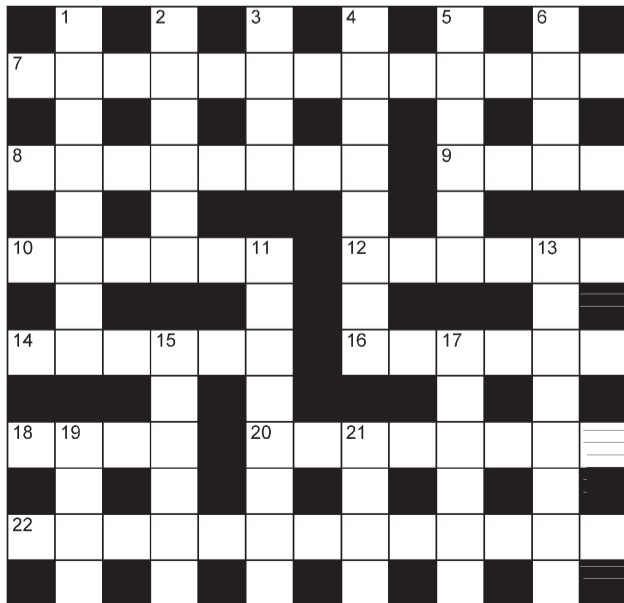

## Walk And Talk

A MIXED bag of weather lately – but it is June, after all! Enjoy some of the blustery winds now that they're a bit warmer.

The Walk and Talk programmes offers different types of walk over different terrains for differing lengths of time, so you're bound to find something that suits you.

**Short Walks** last between 45 minutes and one hour. They are over good surfaces on a fairly flat route with no stiles, and are suitable for newcomers to physical activity.

**Longer Walks** last up to 90 minutes and are across a mixture of canal towpaths, lanes, footpaths and public rights of way across fields. Surfaces may be uneven or muddy in places, there may be slopes and some stiles.

All walks are free and there is no need to book

- just turn up. Dress sensibly for the weather and wear suitable footwear. Smoking is not permitted. Dogs are not allowed, with the exception of guide dogs.
